The STSP Administration operating the "private participation in Wellness Center project" was awarded by the Cabinet-level Committee for the Promotion of Private Participation in Infrastructure Projects, Executive Yuan for their outstanding performance. The team was awarded cash and a pure gold medal. As the first case of cooperation between a public project and private companies in Science Parks, the award is significant.

The Wellness Center is expected to provide sports services and restaurants in September 2007 for employees after working hours.

Tow Away!

More drivers are breaching regulations when parking their cars in the TSP. In light of this problem, the Special Police Corps started towing cars on February 3, 2006. Vehicles that are illegally parked along public roads in the TSP will be removed to the towed-vehicle preserved lot at the Ting 9 public parking space on Nanke Seven Road. Police starts patrolling from 8 am to 8 pm; the period may be prolonged if needed. This measure will elevate traffic safety and quality.

KSP Employee Dormitories are ready for rent

To provide employees in KSP with a comfortable living environment, the STSP Administration spent US\$ 24 million on the construction of the Phase-I dormitories for employees. The dormitories will start leasing in early 2007.

There are 590 units in the single dormitory (including 301 single rooms and 289 twin rooms), 48 units in the family dormitory (122 square meters each) and 12 units in the VIP dormitory (188 square meters each). The three buildings are independent from each other. Each building is 12 stories with a basement for each. The basements are connected and accommodate 381 cars and 413 motorbikes.

Sin Gang Temple Consolidating Many Small Temples into One

Originally, there were ten small temples in the TSP. Since the development project was implemented in 1997, residents have appealed to move the temples. Some people suggested moving all the temples to a new place. After eight years of hard work, a new temple, Sin Gang Temple, was completed on September 8, 2006. Its goal is to "transform small temples into a big one, thereby inviting all gods to guard the region." With the support of the STSP Administration, the Sin Gang Temple Council was set up for sustainable management of the temple.

Sin Gang Temple is designed to combine religions and local cultures. The second floor serves as a shrine for all gods protecting the regions while the ground floor is a cultural and art center for residents in the neighborhood.

Traditional Names for New Roads

The public construction of the Phase-II TSP has been concluded and new roads have been opened. The STSP Administration completed the naming procedures according to legal regulations. All the names are based on original names of the regions, for example, Wuciaojhong Road and Sanbaojhu Road. By doing so, the development of the STSP will not alienate residents from their history.

Good Neighbors Sharing Everything

The city and county governments have cooperated with the STSP tenants on providing job opportunities. On July 22, 2006, the STSP Administration, Tainan County Government, and Employment Services Center for Yunlin-Chiayi-Tainan Region cooperated to launch a Job Fair at the TSP Silaya Plaza for businesses and potential employees. According to conservative estimates, 25,000 people came to the event and 8,000 to 10,000 of them had job interviews at the scene. On May 26, 2006 the Labour Affairs Bureau of Kaohsiung County Government and STSP Administration launched "Job for You: 2006 Vocational Training and Employment Opportunities in Kaohsiung County" with over 60 businesses offering over 5,000 jobs.

The STSP Administration also assists residents in the neighborhood with starting their own businesses. On April 23, 29 and May 6, 2006 the STSP Administration and Kaohsiung County Government organized three seminars on how to start a business for local residents. In the seminar, successful owners of nursery centers, car wash and maintenance services, shops and Kenmos Technology Co. representative on behalf of the Association of Industries in Science Parks, were invited to share their experiences.

Communicative Friendship Game

The STSP Neighborhood Cup and Fun Contest has been organized for seven consecutive years. The Seventh Neighborhood Cup started on July 31, 2006, and five ball competitions and six fun games were held. The number of teams signing up for the games has greatly increased with over 2,500 participants in the fierce competitions.

The competition lasted for almost two months. Since the game is beneficial to the body and to the mind and it develops cordial friendships throughout the neighborhood, the STSP Administration introduces more games every year to make the STSP Neighborhood Cup and Fun Contest more entertaining and interesting.

Also, the 2006 KSP Cup Friendship Game was organized on December 23 to 24, 2006 for the science park employees and residents to promote the habit of exercising.

Press Conference for the Prehistoric Museum and New Book

The Tainan County Government convened a press conference at the STSP Administrative Office to propose the establishment of a national prehistoric museum at the TSP and the release of a new book, a Collection of Archaeology Dissertations Regarding the Findings in the Region of the TSP. The press conference was convened in the hope of accelerating the bid process to establish a national museum and introduce the rich prehistoric cultures of Taiwan County through the release of the dissertation collection.

The new book focused on studies on the archaeological sites found in the TSP. Dr. Cheng-hwa Tsang of Academia Sinica has directed the team of STSP archaeologists for 11 years. It is expected that the book will introduce the public to the beauty of prehistoric cultures before the museum provides a better understanding of the cultural assets of the TSP.

After years of hard work, Mr. Tseng-chang Su, Premier of the Executive Yuan, has promised to construct a prehistoric cultural museum and the Ministry of Education also promised to form a unit of experts. The goal of proposing the establishment of the museum has finally been reached.
