Accomplishing the "Triple-six" Goals for 2008

• The STSP Administration expects to have 60,000 employees and a NT\$600 billion (US\$20 billion) turnover by the end of its sixth year of operation.

Expediting the Establishment of Key Industry Clusters at KSP

- With assistance from the Science and Technology Advisory Group, Executive Yuan, and in collaboration with the Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA) and the Kaohsiung County Government, the STSP Administration was able to establish a photovoltaic industry hub and a medical device industry cluster at the KSP. This includes the establishment of the Center for Photovoltaic Concentrator Power-Generation R&D with the help of the Institute of Nuclear Energy Research (INER), the implementation of the Medical Device Special Zone Development Plan with the help of the MIRDC, and incubation operations carried out by the National Cheng Kung University Business Incubation Center on behalf of the MOEA Small and Medium Enterprise Administration (SMEA).
- Development of the telecommunications industry cluster, spurred on by the leadership of the Telecommunications Technology Center (TTC) and Tatung InfoComm.
- The continued strengthening of the KSP optoelectronics industry chain through Chi Mei Optoelectronics' establishment of its Gen-8.5 plant.
- The continued implementation of the Talent Cultivation Subsidy, Program for Professional and Technical Talent Training, and the Subsidies for encouraging Innovative R&D.
- Integrating research institutions with incubation centers to elevate R&D capabilities.

Expansion of the National Nanke International Experimental High School

- Incorporation of the 2008 inaugural Senior High Department class for a comprehensive educational program.
- Senior-High related campus expansion works in 2008-2010 for a well-rounded educational environment.

Further Enhancement of Commercial, Industrial, and Park-Life Service Capabilities

- The Taiwan Sugar Corporation Storage & Transportation Center at KSP is expected to commence operation in the first quarter of 2008.
- Ready for its soft-opening on April 14, 2008, the TSP Wellness Center will provide employees with a wider variety of options for rest and relaxation, as well as resources for island-wide travel.
- Located in the TSP Commercial and Industrial Services Center, the Premier Restaurant is expected to open in the first quarter of 2008. The restaurant will serve Chinese cuisine, providing a new venue for casual, conference, and banquet dinning.
- The TSP Yingsi Lakeside Recreation Center is expected to open in the second quarter of 2008, providing the winning combination of great food and great scenery.
- TSP Phase-III single and family dormitories are expected to become available in the second quarter of 2008.
- The Luke Light, located in a KSP standard factory building, is expected to open in the first quarter of 2008.

- As work-related fatalities per million-persons reach a new low in 2007, the STSP is on its way to achieving the goal of zero work-related disasters for 2008.
