Subsidies for R&D Piloting Cooperation Project Between Industries and Academia

To encourage the R&D and innovation of the Park enterprises, the STSP Administration, since 2010, has integrated "Subsidies for Encouraging Innovative Industry-Academia R&D" and "Strengthening and Improving Project" to sponsored "Subsidies for R&D Piloting Cooperation Project Between Industries and Academia." A total of 22 projects were granted at the total amount of NT\$85.20 million while Park enterprises also invested NT\$158.53 million as the R&D expenditure.

Manpower Training

Manpower Training Subsidy Project

To connect manpower training on campus and in industries, three major Science Parks co-executed a project to improve the professional knowledge and techniques of senior and junior

students in colleges and universities. Through the introduction to academia-industry cooperation and training courses, good interactions are initiated and the practical needs for manpower of high-tech industry can be met. For the project carried out in School Year 2009 (to the end of July 2010), 12 schools and 18 course modules were subsidized and 1,711 students received training; in School Year 2010 (starting from July 2010), 11 schools and 14 course modules were subsidized with a budget of NT\$9.8 million.

Professional and Technical Talent Training Project

To enhance the professional techniques of Park employees, training courses including IC, optoelectronics, precision machinery, telecommunications, biotechnology, technological management were offered. In 2010, 75 classes for a total of 706 hours as well as four seminars were provided with the total number of trainees reaching 2,906. The STSP Administration paid 85% of training cost for a total amount of NT\$5.986 million.
