"Greeting Ribbon" Image Landscape, a Symbol to Invite the Talents to Return Home for the Creation of Co-Prosperity

Xingangshe Boulevard at the south end was one of the main entrances to the Tainan Science Park and features an especially designed image of the "Rise of the South, Yellow Ribbon Greetings" to welcome its visitors. Incorporate with the diversified public arts along the lake, this image is expected to present the first impression of STSP history and culture, ecological recreation and technology production to punctuate the essence of the STSP. The overall construction was completed on January 25 and since then it has provided an ideal site for the leisure and recreation of employees of Park enterprises and their families.

Public Art Festival

The three-month Public Art Festival was organized by the STSP Administration to be held between January 30 and April 24. In addition to an exhibition of the large-scale "Greeting Ribbon" at the south entrance and 20 pieces of public artwork, the big opening ceremony

attracted the participation of 1,800 attendees. There were about 7,000 people participating in additional 12 workshops, 6 art educational seminars, and 52 guided tours. Park employees and local residents were exposed to different arts and cultures. A permanent exhibition of 13 selected pieces will be held and open for the public later at the Park.

Xinliao Historical Site and Phase III Historical Site Rescue Project at Tainan Science Park

In 2010, the Xinliao Historical Site and Phase III Historical Site Rescue Project were completed (including five sites Sanbaopi, Daoye South, Sanbaopi South, Youxianfang South and Gangang). It consists of at least 29, 836 square meters. An additional seven hectares of rentable area was included. Unearthed historical relics include thousands of pieces of pottery, stoneware, ironware, boneantler-horn tools, shell instrument, glassware, and agate jewelry and were preserved by the National Museum of Prehistory and exhibited at the Gallery of Archaeology at the Tainan Science Park. This project not only extended and exhibited the depth and broadness of culture but also promoted the development effectiveness of land.
